# REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE ENTRY AND EXHIBITION OF LIVESTOCK

## ENTRIES

### 1. CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES

All classes are open to residents of the United Kingdom unless otherwise stated.

The entries for Livestock (except where otherwise stated in the Prize List & Schedule) will close on Friday 13 May, on or before which day all certificates, properly filled up and signed by the exhibitor or his agent, together with entrance fee, must be forwarded to the Secretary of the Society.

Horse and Pony class entries close on Friday 13 May. Entries for Show Jumping Competitions close on Friday 10 June or earlier in competitions where entries are limited. Under no circumstances can entry fees be refunded after the closing date concerned, except under Regulation 7. Show Jumping cancellations will be refunded according to Rule 4 of the Rules and Regulations listed under Show Jumping. Stabling charges are refundable only if the box(es) can be re-let for the period for which they had been booked.

Entries received after the above dates will not be accepted. Telephone, facsimile and emailed entries cannot be accepted.

### 2. OWNERSHIP

All stock must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry. In the event of death of an exhibitor the Executor(s) will be deemed to succeed as such.

### 3. AGE

The date of birth of Cattle and Goats (in the case of Horses, Donkeys and Sheep, the year of birth) must be correctly stated on the entry form, or on the stall cards. Should any question arise as to the age of any exhibit the Stewards may, at the request of the Judge, have the state of dentition of the exhibit examined by a competent authority. If in the opinion of such authority the state of dentition shall indicate that the stated age of any animal does not agree with the dentition test, the Stewards shall have power to disqualify such animal. Any animal having failed to pass the dentition test at any other Show shall forthwith be disqualified.

### 4. EQUINE INFLUENZA

The declaration on the remittance form, to the effect that all horses and ponies have been properly vaccinated against equine influenza, must be signed by the Exhibitor or his/her agent. A certificate showing a single vaccination only will not be acceptable, unless it is clearly shown as a booster administered within the permitted time limit. Foals under six months of age are exempt from vaccination.

Veterinary officers may check certificates and an incorrect certificate will mean disqualification.

Exhibitors who cannot produce a certificate will be required to do so within seven days of the Show otherwise prize money will be forfeited.

**4a.** It is obligatory for all horses, ponies and donkeys to be accompanied by a valid equine passport whenever they are transported to and from Showgrounds. Checks may be carried out by the relevant official authority.

### 5. SUBSTITUTION AND ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

No substitution of entries will be permitted after the closing date for entries and only entries actually printed in the official show catalogue are eligible to compete, except as stated in rule 30.

### 6. CORRECTNESS

Every exhibitor or competitor shall be held responsible for the correctness of his entry. If, when called upon to prove its correctness, he fails to do so, the entry in question shall not be accepted, or if already accepted may be cancelled or the exhibit may be disqualified and any award made to it cancelled.

If any wilful misstatement or incorrectness shall at any time be proved to the satisfaction of the Council to have been made in any certificate, either in connection with the Shows of this Society or any other Agricultural Society, the offenders shall (at the discretion of the Council) be disqualified ever afterwards from exhibiting at the Shows of this Society. If such certificate relates to an animal which has been or shall be awarded a prize at this Society's Show, the prize shall be withheld.

### 7. SPECIAL CONDITION

The Prize Schedule is issued conditionally on the Show being held and is subject to the current Rules, Orders and Regulations of the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs, or of any Special Resolution of the Council of the Society.

In event of an order by the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs prohibiting the movement of stock, half entry fees will be returned on request.

### 8. REJECTION

The Council reserves the right to reject or cancel the entry or entries made by any person if they shall deem fit to do so.

## SHOWGROUND REGULATIONS

### 9. ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

Except where otherwise stated, the Showground will be open for the reception of livestock from 7.00 am on Thursday 14 July.

Latest times of arrival:

Cattle, Sheep, Pigs & Goats 6 pm Thursday 14 July

Horses will be admitted and may depart at the times advertised.

Exhibits in the livestock section will not be allowed to leave the Showground until 5.00 pm on Sunday 17 July unless directed otherwise by the Society's Chief Veterinary Officer.

### 10. EXHIBITORS' PASSES

A free pass for admission will be sent to each exhibitor not a member and also passes for the use of bona-fide servants in charge of the stock. In case of the transfer or improper use of a pass it will be immediately cancelled and the full price of admission charged.

### 11. ACCOMMODATION

All Cattle will be housed in temporary shedding. Shedding, together with hurdle pens, will be provided for sheep and pigs. A marquee, together with hurdle pens, will be provided for goats.

### 12. CONTAGION

Every exhibitor who shall send for exhibition any animal which to his knowledge is suffering from, or has been in contact with, any animal suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, shall forfeit and pay to the Society the sum of £50 as and for liquidated damages for each and every animal so sent, and in the event of the Society's Veterinary Inspector certifying that any animal sent for exhibition is in his opinion a possible source of danger, such animal shall be removed with due speed by the exhibitor, or his servant, from the Showground, or be otherwise dealt with as the Veterinary Inspector may direct with a view to averting the spread of contagion.

### 12A. MISUSE OF DRUGS

The Society reserves the right to take blood and urine samples from any animal at the Show for the testing for the presence of illegal substances.

### 13. FORAGE

Straw for first litter only will be provided free of charge on Thursday 14 July; subsequently exhibitors must provide their own, together with all provender required during the time their animals are on the Showground.

### 14. ROSETTES

No animal will be allowed to wear rosettes or ribbons and no prize cards may be displayed other than those issued by the Stewards of the Society.

### 15. SECURITY

All bulls must have a ring or clamp attached to the nose and be led by their attendants.

All animals must be brought properly secured to the satisfaction of the Stewards of the Department, or they will not be admitted to the Showground.

### 15A. NO SMOKING

Strictly no smoking in any buildings or marquees on the Showground.

### 16. ADVERTISING

No person shall be allowed to fix any placard in the Showground without the written permission of the Secretary and no exhibitor shall be allowed to distribute handbills anywhere in the Showground.

### 17. PUBLIC VIEW

Any exhibitor or herdsman shutting out his exhibits from the public view by letting down or affixing canvas, or in any other way except with the sanction of the Stewards, or refusing to conform to the instructions of any Steward, or failing to parade or exhibit the animals in his charge when so directed, will be fined £5.00 for each and every such offence which shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Stewards, such fines to be deducted from any prizes which may be due to such exhibitor, or to be recoverable as debts to the Society.

### 18. EVICTION

The Stewards shall have power to remove from the Showground the stock belonging to (and cancel the pass of) any exhibitor who shall refuse to comply with the instructions given by the Stewards, without any responsibility attaching to the Stewards or the Society in consequence of such removal.

## JUDGING AND AWARDS

### 19. JUDGING

No person but the Stewards and authorised officials shall enter any of the rings or have any communication with the Judges during the time the judging is taking place and all exhibitors or their agents acting in opposition to this rule shall forfeit such premiums as may be awarded to their exhibits.

The Judges may withhold any prize where there is evident want of merit. Where there is only one entry shown in a class, the judges may award the first, second, third or fourth prize according to the merit of that entry.

Once a class has started, late competitors will be allowed into the ring only if the Judge is prepared to accept them.

The decision of the Judge is final.

Exhibitors are particularly requested to note the name of the Judge appointed for the classes they wish to enter and are advised, in the interests of all concerned, not knowingly to enter an animal bred by or that has been owned by the Judge appointed.

In the event of a judge knowingly encountering an animal in which he/she has had a past or present financial or breeder interest, the Kent County Agricultural Society will arrange for the placement of that animal by another judge.

**19A.** All those entering the rings with horses and ponies or to attend horses and ponies must be properly dressed, ie wearing hats, jackets and the appropriate exhibit number where applicable.

**19B.** Anyone riding a horse or pony on the Showground, practice areas or car parks must wear a hat of a standard approved by the governing body of his/her respective horse/pony society, association or discipline and under whose rules he/she is exhibiting or competing.

### 20. PRIZES

In all cases where the prizes are offered conditionally, they shall be withheld until the exhibitor shall have proved to the satisfaction of the Council that the conditions have been fulfilled.

Prize money will be paid within one month of the Show.

All cups and trophies offered by the Kent County Agricultural Society in this schedule are perpetual and cannot be won outright.

### 20A. AMALGAMATION OR CANCELLATION OF CLASSES

Any class may be cancelled or amalgamated unless there are at least three entries.

### 21. RESERVE AWARDS

In awarding prizes, the Judges are instructed to add a reserve number in each instance (provided there is sufficient merit), stating the next best animal or pen of animals, in case any animal or pen of animals to which a prize has been awarded should be disqualified.

In the case of any prize animal being disqualified, the winner of the next succeeding prize in that class shall take the prize that has been awarded to such disqualified animal, and the lowest prize in the class shall go to the reserve number provided a reserve card has been awarded.

### 22. TEMPORARY ACCIDENT

Any animal suffering from an accident, having temporary consequences only, will not be disqualified on that account.

### 23. PROGENY

All foals must be the offspring of the mares with which they are exhibited and accompany them into the judging ring.

### 24. PROTESTS

Any exhibitor wishing to make a protest, having reference to any exhibit at the Annual Show of the Society, must make it in writing to the Secretary and deposit the sum of £20.00, which may, at the discretion of the Council be forfeited to the funds of the Society, if the protest should appear to them to be frivolous or unreasonable. All protests must be delivered to the Secretary before 5 pm on the day of judging. After that hour no protest will be received unless a special and satisfactory reason can be given for the delay. The Council will consider any such protests at its meeting at 10.30 am on the following day at which time any person making a protest or his authorised agent must be available to answer questions if required. Protests lodged against awards made on the third day of the Show will be considered at a time and place which will be fixed by the Council. The decision of the Council shall be final.

## GENERAL

### 25. PARADES

The livestock will be paraded daily in the ring at the discretion of the Stewards and exhibitors are requested to see that sufficient stockmen are in attendance for this purpose.

Livestock and Horse Parades will be held as directed by the Council of the Society and at the times fixed and advertised in the Catalogue. Any prize winner who fails to parade without authority loses any prize money unless a certificate is produced signed by a Veterinary Surgeon or a substantial reason is forwarded in writing and handed to the Chief Steward responsible for the Parade giving such reasons. The Chief Steward will report to the Council of the Society, whose decision shall be final as to the forfeiting of any prize money.

Handlers under the age of 13 years will NOT be permitted to take animals into the Grand Parade.

## **26. DISCLAIMER**

Exhibits, the public and all stock and servants are subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Society.

Neither the Society nor any of its officers or servants will be responsible for anything that may happen from any cause or circumstances whatever to exhibitors, their servants or any person visiting or attending the Show, or through or to any animal or article exhibited at the Show and it shall be considered a condition of entry or admission to the grounds that each person shall hold the Society harmless and that they shall indemnify the Society against any legal proceedings arising from any such case or circumstances.

## **27. DISPUTES**

All disputes respecting the Rules and Regulations of the Society together with all questions, the consideration of which is not otherwise provided for, shall be referred to the Stewards or Council, whose decision shall be final.

## **CATTLE**

### **28. EXHIBITS FROM ATTESTED HERDS**

Cattle at the date of entry must be from herds which are free from movement restrictions imposed under the Tuberculosis (Area Eradication Order, 1950, as amended). An animal accepted for entry cannot be exhibited, if after entry, the herd to which it belongs is subject to such restriction. See also Brucellosis Accredited Herds Scheme on page 10.

### **29. REGISTRATION IN HERD BOOK**

All cattle must be named and the number given if entered in the Herd Book.  
Every animal entered for competition shall be entered or accepted for entry in the Herd Book proper of its breed unless otherwise stated. Where an animal is entered by the exhibitor as accepted for entry in the Herd Book proper of its breed, proof of such acceptance shall be furnished to the Secretary of the Society at the time of entry.

### **30. SUBSTITUTION**

Substitution of animals in the cattle section will be allowed after the closing date for entries provided the animal substituted is in the same class as the original entry. Details of the substitute entry must be given to the Chief Steward of Cattle on arrival at the Showground and this information must be displayed above the stall on a special card provided by the Steward. Failure to notify the Chief Steward of Cattle will result in disqualification and any prizes won will be forfeited.

### **31. FAKING**

Should any contrivance or device of any description (such as blistering, bandaging, boarding of udders or the setting of teats) be found or proved to have been used on a cow or heifer at any time while the animal is on the Showground, either for preventing or influencing abnormally the flow of milk or for any other purpose, the Council, at its absolute discretion, shall have the power to disqualify the cow or heifer so concerned from any award or trophy at the Show and may prohibit the owner of such cow or heifer from exhibiting at future Shows. The Council reserves the right to have all cows and heifers inspected by persons nominated by them, either prior to, during, or after judging.

### **31. CALVING AT SHOW**

If an animal calves during the period of the Show, the instructions listed on page 11 must be followed.

### **32. MILKING**

The vacuum pump in the Dairy will be available for the use of exhibitors arriving on Thursday 14 July. However milk will be accepted for payment between the hours of 5 pm and 7 pm only.

The Show being purely of an educational nature, it behoves producers of milk to ensure that the milking of cows and disposal of the milk is carried out under hygienic conditions at the Show Dairy. The following Regulations are therefore designed for the benefit of exhibitors and the public.

- 1) Suitable white clothing must be worn by all attendants.
- 2) Udders and hind quarters must be in a clean condition before milking.
- 3) All milking must be done in the Show Dairy. In order to be of assistance to exhibitors and herdsmen the following arrangements have been made:
  - a) All milk produced during the Show will become property of the Society and will be purchased by the Society at 18p per litre. The sale of milk by exhibitors or their herdsmen other than to the Society is strictly prohibited.
  - b) All pails and utensils can be washed and sterilised at the Show Dairy free of charge.
  - c) Hot water will be provided.
  - d) To prevent contamination of milk by antibiotics, random testing of milk will be carried out by Stewards at the Show.

## **SHEEP**

**33.** Every animal entered for competition must be entered or certified as eligible to be entered in the Flock Book of its breed.

**34.** "Two-Shear" and "Shearing" are meant sheep dropped in 2009 and 2010 respectively.

**35.** The colouring of sheep is prohibited. Any sheep found to have been artificially coloured or otherwise faked with a view to deceiving the Judges shall be disqualified.

**36.** The Welfare of Livestock (Prohibited Operations) Regulation 1982 (January 1983) requires that sheep must have sufficient tail retained to cover the vulva of the female sheep and the anus of male sheep. Any sheep which does not comply with the aforementioned regulations will not be eligible to be judged in its class. The decision will be made at the discretion of the Society's Chief Veterinary Officer or his representative.

#### **SHEEP & GOATS**

**37.** Scrapie. Ewes which have lambed in the previous 30 days, in lamb ewes and ewes that are subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding pattern may not be exhibited at the Kent Show. Also female goats which have kidded in the previous 30 days and in kid goats may not be exhibited at the Kent Show. All exhibitors of sheep and goats will be required to sign a declaration to this effect at entry stage.

#### **HEALTH & SAFETY**

**38.** The Organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.

# IMPORTANT NOTES FOR ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

## Brucellosis Eradication

Cattle which calve or show evidence of calving whilst on the Showground must be placed in the approved isolation **immediately** pending their possible early removal from the Showground.

Where an animal calves full term and the owner arranges for a blood sample and a vaginal swab to be taken privately and submitted to an approved laboratory (eg VIC, Itchen Abbas, Winchester, SO21 1BX Telephone 01962 779966) **and** the results are negative, the animal may return to the Show lines at the discretion of the Show Secretary.

Where an animal calves prematurely or aborts, the Divisional Veterinary Office, Liberty House, 105 Bell Street, Reigate, Surrey, Telephone 01737 242242 **must be informed immediately**. The animal must be placed in the approved isolation accommodation pending sampling by a DEFRA authorised Veterinary Surgeon. If the animal calves or aborts before it can be isolated, full precautions must be taken to isolate and disinfect any possible contaminated standings, bedding, utensils, clothing and vehicles. The animal cannot take part in the Show and once fit to travel\* can be returned home. The suspect animal must be isolated during transit.

When milking, udder cloths, hands or milking machine units must be suitably disinfected between each cow.

Dams may suckle their own calves. All other calves must be fed reconstituted dried milk.

### \* **The EU Welfare of Animals in Transport Regulation (EC) No 1/2005.**

All exhibitors must ensure that they comply fully with the current legislation issued by the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs regarding the above Transport Regulation which came into force in January 2007 and are able to provide the appropriate documentation at the Show to the relevant governing authority.

### **For the purposes of this article, mammals shall not be considered fit for transport if they**

- (a) are unfit animals (see DEFRA website Annex 1 Chapter 1 of Council Regulation 1/2005).
- (b) are pregnant female animals that have reached the latest stage of gestation (within 10% of the estimated time of the gestation before birth) and for a period of one week after giving birth.
- (c) are very young animals except if the journey is less than 100 km, eg calves of less than 10 days of age, pigs less than 3 weeks of age and lambs of less than one week.
- (d) calves of less than 14 days of age on journeys exceeding 8 hours will not be permitted.

## **SHEEP AND GOAT HEALTH SCHEMES**

*The Society will accept entries from exhibitors with non accredited sheep and Maedi Visna accredited sheep as detailed under each breed.*

*Each exhibitor with MV accredited sheep must send a blank photocopy of his/her VALID GREEN SAC CERTIFICATE (showing the expiry date) with a statement of entries, entry forms, remittance for all charges and a completed declaration regarding Scrapie before the closing date of entries, Friday 13 May 2011. (An original VALID GREEN SAC CERTIFICATE completed with animal's details and signed and dated for the date of the event by the exhibitor must accompany the sheep to the Show - see details below).*

*The areas of the Showground, where MV accredited sheep will be housed, judged and any routes of movement, into, out of or within the Showground will be cleared of non accredited stock more than 7 days prior to the date stock enters the Showground for the Show. MV accredited sheep will not be permitted to use any ground or routes that have been used by non-accredited sheep during this minimum time limit.*

*Separate accommodation will be provided for MV accredited sheep and non-accredited sheep. In the sheep area, there will be separate clearly marked walkways for MV accredited and non-accredited sheep and judging rings will be divided into MV accredited and non accredited areas. There will also be separate loading/unloading points for MV accredited and non-accredited sheep.*

*To gain admission to the Sheep & Goat Health Scheme approved accommodation at the Show, MV accredited sheep must be accompanied by a completed valid green SAC certificate of status, signed and dated for the date of the event by the exhibitor. No current certificate means no unloading in the Maedi Visna accredited area.*

*The flock scheme status must also be shown on the entry form. Entries for MV accredited and non accredited sheep must be completed on separate entry forms.*

*If MV accredited and non-accredited sheep are to be judged in the same ring the following conditions will apply.*

- 1) All sheep must be halter or collar led.*
- 2) The judging ring will be divided by two lines of barriers with a 2m gap between to prevent contact between different categories at all times.*
- 3) Non-accredited sheep will enter and exit the judging ring at a different point to MV accredited sheep.*
- 4) Any examination such as mouthing should be performed by the leader and not the judge.*

*It is essential that sheep exhibitors follow all written and verbal instructions.*

## **EXHIBITORS (FLOCK OWNERS) ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FOLLOWING:**

*The prevention of any contact with sheep (or goats) of a different category at all times. If no contact has been made, sheep may return home without any isolation.*

*If contact has been made, then sheep will lose their MV status and must be placed in isolation on return and undergo appropriate blood tests to regain their scheme status. Please contact SAC Membership Helpline for advice (01908 249927).*

*Whilst the Society will take all necessary precautions to protect the status of MV accredited sheep, it will not hold itself responsible for any accidental contacts made which may affect the status of an exhibitor's flock.*

## **SCRAPIE MONITORED FLOCKS**

*Ewes which have lambed in the previous 30 days and in lamb ewes may not be exhibited at the Kent Show. (See rule 37 under the regulations governing the entry and exhibition of livestock).*

*ALL sheep exhibitors will be required to complete and sign the 'Declaration Regarding Scrapie' on the livestock entry form (without which entries will not be accepted) and forward it with a remittance for all charges to the Secretary of the Kent County Agricultural Society by the closing date of entries (Friday 13 May).*

#### **BLUETONGUE**

*The Kent County Agricultural Society encourages all livestock exhibitors to vaccinate their animals against Bluetongue.*

#### **SHEEP SCAB**

*It is advisable to treat sheep coming to the Show with an approved Scab control product carried out to the manufacturer's specification.*

#### **SHORT DOCKING OF SHEEP**

*Short docking of sheep is forbidden. (See rule 36 of the Regulations Governing the Entry and Exhibition of Livestock). ALL SHEEP, INCLUDING IMPORTED SHEEP, ENTERING CLASSES AT THE KENT SHOW MUST COMPLY WITH THIS RULE. SHORT DOCKED SHEEP WILL NOT BE JUDGED.*
