

Kent County Show – Heritage Section

Rules and Regulations 2020



Security and Show Times

- All exhibits must be in place by 8.00am each morning and will not be moved (other than for parades) until 6.30pm each evening or later as deemed safe to proceed.
- Security will be in place on both the Main and Back gates for 24 hours a day from Sunday 5 July to Wednesday 15 July 2020. Gate 4 will be operational on Thursday 9 July to Sunday 12 July between 7.00am and 7.00pm.
- The Kent County Show is open from 8.00am to 6.00pm each day.
- All exhibits and caravans must have left site by Wednesday 15 July 2020.

Tickets

- Exhibits will be given the appropriate vehicle passes to gain access to the Showground.
- Each exhibit will be issued with two one day entrance tickets to the Show for each day that they exhibit.
- No refunds will be given to anyone who arrives without the appropriate passes.

Insurance

- All vehicles and working machines must be insured against third party risks including use for off road and/or display use. Documentation must be brought to the Kent County Show and may be checked by the appropriate steward.

Movement of Vehicles

- The Road Traffic Act applies to all places to which the public have access.
- Drivers should be of legal age, competent and authorised to operate the vehicle being used.
- Movement of all vehicles is restricted to travel to and from the ring or for permitted display purposes.
- The speed limit on the Showground is 10 mph. This applies to ALL vehicles on the Showground. The one way system of the Showground must be observed at all times.
- No more than one person can ride on a tractor during parade, regardless of the number of seats it was manufactured with.
- Riders on vehicles and implements will be considered at the stewards' discretion.
- If the vehicle is fitted with seatbelts, it is advised that they are worn when travelling on the Showground.

Vehicles manufactured less than 40 years ago

- Exhibits which were manufactured less than 40 years since the Show date will only be considered if of exceptional historic interest and at the discretion of the section steward.

General Requirements

- Entries received after Friday 22 May 2020 may not feature in the catalogue listings. No entries will be accepted after Friday 12 June 2020.
- The placing of exhibits will be at the discretion of the Society and their Stewards, although every endeavour will be made to meet any request made by an exhibitor.
- All persons must pay proper regard to the steward's instructions and should conduct themselves in a manner, which will not inconvenience other persons at the event.
- Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times and are not allowed access to any building on site. Please do not allow your dog to foul on either the Show site or the car parks.
- Generators are strictly forbidden in the exhibition area on the Showground. The Society asks that only quiet generators are used in the camping area and that these are turned off between 10.00pm and 6.00am each night.

Section Regulations

Please note, if your section is not listed only the previous regulations will apply:

Steam Engines

- All steam exhibitors are required to only use the low smoke coal provided for them at the Kent County Show.
- All steam exhibitors must be covered by a Public Liability Policy including Rally use, and by a Boiler Explosion Policy, both Policies having a limit of indemnity of not less than £1,000,000 for any one accident, and Sparks and Ashes cover for not less than £30,000 for the whole Show period.
- In the case of any event taking place wholly or partly on the public highway, that the use of the vehicle hereby entered is covered by insurance as required by the Road Traffic Act 1988 which is valid for such part of this event as shall take place on roads defined in that Act.
- The boiler of any steam plant entered must carry a current Board of Trade Inspection Certificate and documentary evidence of such Insurance and Inspection must be produced before participating in the Rally.
- Drivers should be of legal age, competent and authorised to operate the vehicle being used.

Forms must be completed and a copy returned to the appropriate steward.

Due to the large number of entries received, not all vehicles can be accepted for the 2020 Kent County Show. If you are unsuccessful your steward will inform you as soon as they are able to do so.
